### RESPONSE TO THE TREATY PRINCIPLES BILL

I know that many in our community have written to MPs in support of the food relief work undertaken by the Auckland City Mission. This week, I received a letter from David Seymour, MP for Epsom and Act Leader. He stated:

'I support the great and necessary work that the Auckland City Mission has done for over 100 years in our city. I have been in touch with the Minister of Social Development's

I have been in touch with the Minister of Social Development's office seeking information about the review of charity food support funding that has recently taken place.

In consideration of the increased demand for ongoing food support in the community, the Government has agreed that \$7.5 million of time-limited funding will also be available in F2024/25

This funding is being allocated to:

- 1. Support 60 community food providers, such as foodbanks, to meet high demand (\$6m)
- 2. Invest in or expand up to ten food security initiatives which aim to increasethe amount of healthy and affordable food in communities (\$1.5m)

I realize these are difficult times for many people in our community. However, the Government is committed to getting the economy working properly so that wehave the resources to look after our most vulnerable.'

I will continue to work with Auckland City Missioner, Helen Robinson, as the Anglican Diocese of Auckland looks to address this critical issue in our society. We will meet with David Seymour on 12 December to discuss government support and funding going forward.

I encourage you to read the information in this newsletter about the Cathedral Christmas Can Tree, and consider donating what food items you can to this important cause.


### ADVENT & CHRISTMAS AT HOLY TRINITY CATHEDRAL


# HELP THE ANGLICAN TRUST FOR WOMEN AND CHILDREN
