While a member of the King's Singers he was able to perform alongside artists such as George Shearing, Richard Rodney Bennett and John Dankworth, all of whose influences can be seen in this work. The text is in the traditional Greek and Latin. We hope you find this different style of music helpful as a slightly different approach to music in liturgy. 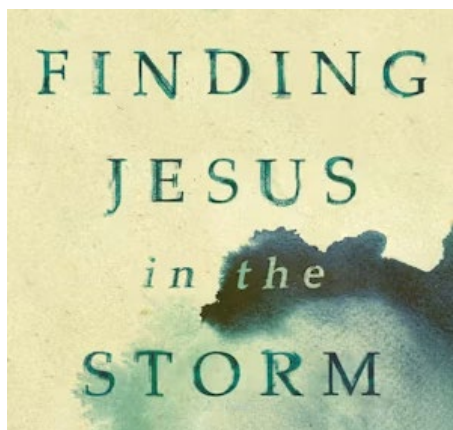
## ADVENT & CHRISTMAS AT HOLY TRINITY CATHEDRAL

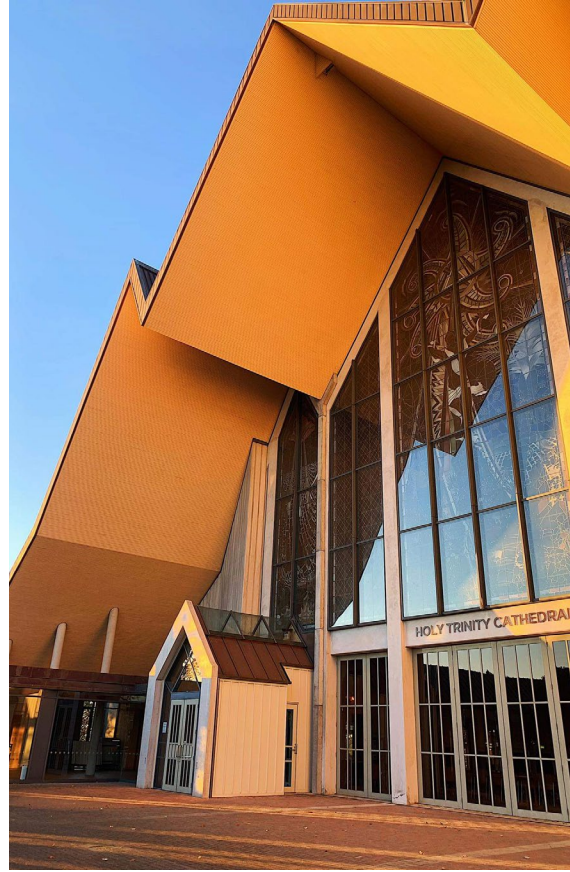
