He is buried at the cemetery of an interesting Catholic church of St Mary, which was built in 1930-ies by the Dutch Catholic Vincentian priests, in fully traditional Javanese style. and is an exemplar of a great architectural inculturation of Christianity into a local culture.

Do keep me, and especially the first part of my being away, in your prayers, hoping that I will return with a broader smile!

The 2022 Lambeth Conference of Anglican Bishops Lambeth Call on the Environment and Sustainable Development, reads:

The Anglican Communion is a connected body. We are local. We are global; We are impacted by the environmental crisis. We contributed to the problem, we can contribute to the solution; The Five Marks of Mission call us to share the Good News and express our concern for people and the planet; Acting together, we can protect restore and safeguard the environment; For ourselves and for future generations we must act now and urgently.



THE GLOBAL ANGLICAN CHURCH

The mission of the Church is the Mission of Christ. The 5 marks of mission are:

- 1. To proclaim the Good News of the kingdom.
- 2. To teach, baptise and nurture new believers.
- 3. To respond to human need with loving service.
- 4. To seek to transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind and pursue peace and reconciliation
- 5. To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth.

Summarised in the key words: evangelising, teaching, compassion, justice and care of creation. Specifically for the 4th and 5th mark;

In seeking justice - we remember that Jesus Christ sends us 'into the world' to love, to serve and seek the "wellbeing of the people around us.

In using and caring for creation - we are handling what belongs to Jesus Christ from the time of creation.



THE DIOCESE OF AOTEAROA, NZ AND POLYNESIA

The Auckland Anglican Response to the Climate Crisis (AARCC) 2020 plan provides ministry units witha framework and goals to achieve in four areas of action:

Liturgy and Worship - To incorporate creation care into our worship and liturgical practices.

Education - To have an educational focus on climate change and sustainability issues.

Mitigation - To reduce out carbon footprint, move towards renewable forms of energy and follow good practises.

Advocacy and Outreach - To be a prophetic voice for; social change, reform of political and economic structures that cause or exacerbate climate change and to reach out to the wider community collaborating with local initiatives for care of creation as a role model for sustainability.



While including the Anglican Communion Marks of Mission, The Lambeth Call on the Environment and Sustainable Development and the Auckland Anglican Response to the Climate Crisis in our "Care of Creation" plan Holy Trinity Cathedral is committed to:

Serving Society Through compassion and justice and;

Caring through Creation through godly use of the resources of creation along with ecological concerns and actions.

A small working group has been designing the theology, purpose and objectives of our work in this area of responsibility as a Christian community.

On Sunday 8th September as part of the Care of Creation month we will offer a presentation outlining the work we have done so far.

- We will have a look at the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals and explore how they Inform our work.

This will be a very hands-on collaborative workshop and we would love as many of you as possible to join us for this exciting development and see what we have done and what we could do going forward to be faithful stewards of God's creation.




SPONSOR A CHORISTER
