What a weekend in Wellington!

Over Labour weekend, the Holy Trinity Cathedral choir—led by Peter Watts and Dr Philip Smith—Chris and I travelled down the Wellington for the NZ Anglican Cathedral Choirs' Festival.

The festival takes place biennially—the last gathering was hosted here in Auckland in 2022—and this year, we were very warmly welcomed by the clergy, choir and congregation of Wellington Cathedral of St Paul.

From rehearsals, to the concert on Saturday, and two festal services on the Sunday, the weekend was a powerful celebration and proof that sacred choral music is still going strong in Aotearoa! I was glad to have the opportunity to co-celebrate the Eucharist on Sunday and so had a front row seat, so to speak.

Holy Trinity Cathedral mounted a force of 20 singers to contribute to the total of 160 choristers from the eight Anglican cathedrals across the country that took part in the weekend's music making.

I would like to acknowledge the huge amount of time, everyy and talent which Peter, Philip and our dedicated choristers put into representing Holy Trinity Cathedral so well at this event. I would also thank the many of you in our community who so generously contributed to helping get an entire choir to Wellington and back.

VIRIDITAS: A CREATION-CENTERED ADVENT STUDY

These words sound very contemporary and relevant to our struggles to confront the climate crisis. They were written by the German Abbess, composer, philosopher, and mystic Hildegard of Bingen, who lived in the twelfth century. Hildegard coined the term 'viriditas', by which she meant 'God's living power of light in Creation.'

As we prepare for Advent we will gather over four sessions to explore what 'God's living power of light in Creation' might imply for us. Join us as we consider how we might tend to fresh green shoots emerging in our journey of faith as we seek to follow that light.

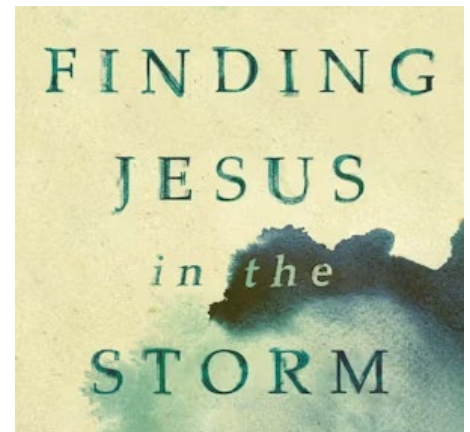

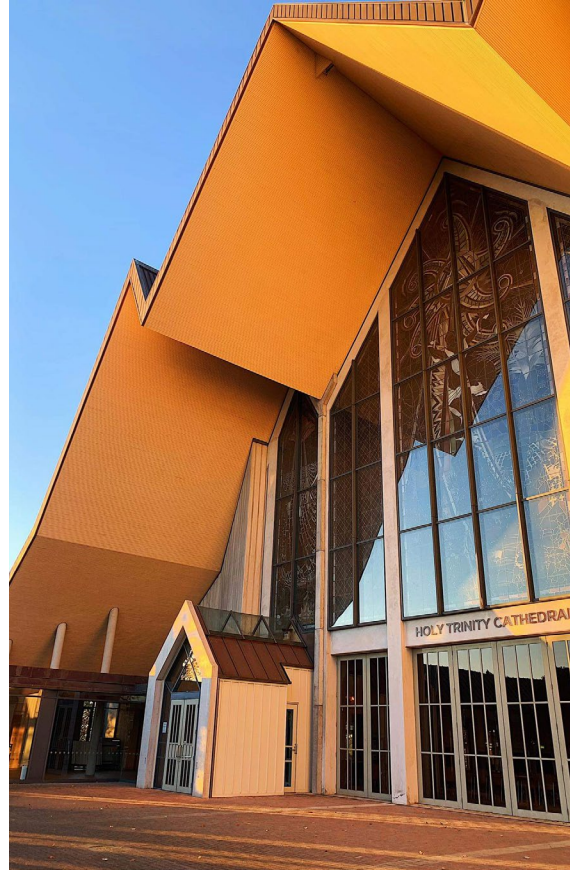
