Over Labour weekend, the Holy Trinity Cathedral choir—led by Peter Watts and Dr Philip Smith—Chris and I travelled down the Wellington for the NZ Anglican Cathedral Choirs' Festival.

The festival takes place biennially—the last gathering was hosted here in Auckland in 2022—and this year, we were very warmly welcomed by the clergy, choir and congregation of Wellington Cathedral of St Paul.

From rehearsals, to the concert on Saturday, and two festal services on the Sunday, the weekend was a powerful celebration and proof that sacred choral music is still going strong in Aotearoa! I was glad to have the opportunity to co-celebrate the Eucharist on Sunday and so had a front row seat, so to speak.

Holy Trinity Cathedral mounted a force of 20 singers to contribute to the total of 160 choristers from the eight Anglican cathedrals across the country that took part in the weekend's music making.

I would like to acknowledge the huge amount of time, evergy and talent which Peter, Philip and our dedicated choristers put into representing Holy Trinity Cathedral so well at this event. I would also thank the many of you in our community who so generously contributed to helping get an entire choir to Wellington and back.

This Sunday evening, we will observe our Requiem Eucharist for All Souls. The Cathedral choir has prepared the famous Requiem by Gabriel Fauré which will punctuate the service.

This service provides a special opportunity to come together, remember those we have lost, pray for them and light a candle in their memory. It is a poignant service which many find helpful in dealing with grief and loss.

We welcome all who wish to to gather as a community to remember our collective losses in the last year and well as our individual ones.

The names of those who we wish to remember will be read as part of the serivce.

VIRIDITAS: A CREATION-CENTERED **ADVENT STUDY**


