

On Tuesday, Chris and I were invited to the opening of the new Auckland New Zealand Temple of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Manukau. The visit consisted of a special guided tour by the couple pictured above of the impressive building which boasts a 54m-high spire and sits on more than 4ha, visible for miles around. We were warmly welcomed and found the visit meaningful and interesting as part of our ecumenical outreach.

This week, much of my time has been occupied by the New Zealand Deans' Conference which, this year, has been held in Auckland. It is always an enriching experience to meet with my contemporaries at the seven other Cathedrals across New Zealand to share and compare. The conference began with a Eucharist and prayer walk at All Souls Church in Clevedon and, on Sunday our Cathedral will host the Deans at our 10am Eucharist. As part of this service, The Very Reverend Ben Truman will preach the sermon. Ben has held the position of Dean of Christchurch for a little over a year and is the youngest Dean to be appointed to that role.

Then, at 5pm, we will host another of the eminently popular Come and Sing Evensong services with almost 60 choristers! A bumper day at Holy Trinity Cathedral!

This Sunday will be the last opportunity to return your palm crosses from previous years to the bowl under the Nave bell. They will be burnt to form the ash for Ash Wednesday.





INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY CHARITY YOGA




