GREETINGS! NGĀ MIHI!

It is with great joy that we welcome as preacher at our 10am Choral Eucharist on Sunday Fr Andriy Mykytyuk, Synkellos for the Laity, a priest of the Eparchy of Sts Peter and Paul of Melbourne for Ukrainian Catholics in Australia, New Zealand and Oceania. The Ukrainian Greek Catholics are a Church that in their practice use Byzantine rite (like the Orthodox Churches), but recognise Bishop of Rome (The Pope) as a head of the Church.

Since the beginning of the aggression and open war in Ukraine in February 2022, our community has held Ukraine and its people regularly in our prayers. Our 2022 Lenten appeal supported the work of the the Croatian Greek Catholic Church for Ukrainian refugees in Croatia.

Fr Andriy is visiting Ukrainians in New Zealand and will celebrate the Divine Liturgy with the Ukrainian community of Auckland on Sunday. Hence, we are grateful that he has found time to be with us also. This furthers our ongoing relationship as he and his Bishop, Mykola Bychok, have already visited our Cathedral. We hope to hear from Fr Andriy a little of the spiritual richness of the Christian East.

We continue to pray for the people of Ukraine, for the many refugees, for those who have lost their loved ones, their homes, their property. Our prayer is also for the gift of wisdom to all who are deciding on issues of war and peace.

With peace and justice, may full freedom for Ukraine prevail! Слава Україні! Героям слава! (Glory to Ukraine! Glory to the heroes!)

FAREWELL, ELIANA!

Next Sunday 8 September will be the last time we will see one of our longest-standing members of the Cathedral choir for some time. Eliana Dunford will be leaving us for Oxford, UK where she will embark on a three-year DPhil at St Cross College. She has earned a Clarendon Scholarship for this study which totals approximately \$300,000!

In Eliana's own words:

'I'll be focusing on the music of the 20th-century Polish composer and violinist Grażyna Bacewicz. She had a really interesting life, living in Warsaw through both World Wars (even giving secret underground concerts!) and then through Poland's Soviet period - and she is one of the female composers whose works are just starting to gain proper traction now.

When I'm not working on my research, I'll be soaking up the choral scene at Oxford, hopefully in both a chapel choir and a concert choir, and I have some auditions lined up for these.

I'm also really looking forward to being near London, so that I can hear all the brilliant orchestras, choirs, and soloists that come through so regularly.

I've been in the Cathedral choir since 2017, and will really miss the music-making and wonderful people here! Hopefully I will be able to come back and sing with the choir again at some point in the next few years. If any in Holy Trinity Cathedral have contacts in Oxford, I would love to hear from them!'

We will greatly miss Eliana's contribution to the music and community life of our Cathedral, and thank her for the talent and dedication she has exhibited as a valued member of the Cathedral choir. We wish Eliana every success in the future and hope she feels assured of finding a home here at Holy Trinity Cathedral whenever she returns to Auckland.

The 2022 Lambeth Conference of Anglican Bishops Lambeth Call on the Environment and Sustainable Development, reads:

The Anglican Communion is a connected body. We are local. We are global; We are impacted by the environmental crisis. We contributed to the problem, we can contribute to the solution; The Five Marks of Mission call us to share Good News and express our concern for people and the planet; Acting together, we can protect restore and safeguard the environment; For ourselves and for future generations we must act now and urgently.

As part of our Cathedral Strategic action we are committed to developing policy and action for the Care of Creation. A small working group has been designing the theology, purpose and objectives of our work in this area of responsibility as a Christian community.

On Sunday 8th September as part of the Care of Creation month we will offer a presentation outlining the work we have done so far.

- We will have a look at the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals and explore how they Inform our work.



We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is giving, then give generously. - Romans 12:8

These words come from another Paul – the saint, in his letter to the Romans. They provide the framing for the launch of our **24 for 24** stewardship campaign.

Parishioners contribute as volunteers across an extraordinary range of activities in the Cathedral, and that is something to celebrate. However, there's another aspect of our giving which is critical to the running of this place, and that is money.

Why is this stewardship campaign needed?

It costs \$1.2m every year to run this unique precinct – providing worship, liturgy, civic commemoration, music, performance, and public and private events.

So where does the money come from?

We gratefully receive 80% of it from a range of sources. There are trusts – such as the Cathedral Trust for Ministry, Music and Mission. There is an annual operational grant from the Diocese, there are bequests, venue hire fees for events both large and small, car parking, and sundry income. The remaining 20% of our annual income comes from giving which we as parishioners do. It currently totals \$220,000 per year. This sounds like a lot, but this figure hasn't changed in five years—in fact since the last stewardship campaign in 2019. This is probably because most giving now is by AP—automatic payments that each of us has set up to transfer a sum to the Cathedral's account on a regular basis. This was a big help during the Covid years, however, there is a downside —that it's so easy to set and forget this arrangement.

The problem?

In the five years since 2019, inflation has eaten away 24% of the value of an unchanged donation. So that is why, in 2024, we're setting the goal of increasing regular giving to update this amount. If we can raise current giving by 24%, or nearly a quarter extra, we'll raise the annual giving total to over \$270,000. This will help in keeping the budget stable, and allowing the Cathedral to operate sustainably. It's the reason for the campaign name **24 for 24**.

How can I help?

So, the challenge in front of us all (myself included) is:

- To begin making one-off gifts or regular contributions if you haven't done so yet.
- To increase the amount, if you currently give regularly, by up to 24%.

Remember too, that for every dollar you donate, you get one third back as a tax refund.

Let me also acknowledge that for some in our parish, a **24 for 24** target isn't possible. No problem! Give whatever you can. It will be gratefully received and put to good use.





The last word I will give to St Paul: 'If your gift is giving, then give generously.'
