2024 DIOCESAN SYNOD REPORT

Among the issues discussed at this year's Diocesan Synod was that of how best to use assets to advance mission and ministry. The Bishop in his Charge, referred to the challenge of balancing rising costs of maintaining and insuring buildings with constraints posed by decreasing numbers and fewer volunteers but noted challenges also offered opportunities. Further work is to be done and reported back to Synod 2025.

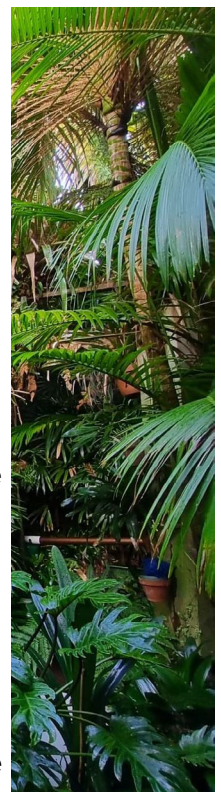

CLIMATE RESISTANT CITIES

Mark van Kaathoven who worships with the congregation at St Stephen's Chapel has just presented his work using green waste for regenerative gardening and fostering increased biodiversity to the 11th World Green Infrastructure Conference on 4 September. Mark also hosted tours for the conference participants of his garden and various parks on 5 September.

Out of this experience the International Climate Adaptation Research Institute has asked him to participate in their conference—More Climate Resistant Cities—in Bratislava, Slovakia. He will share his insights into how we can work to make our cities more climate proof and enjoyable. Chris Mills has brought green waste from the cathedral precinct to the parks Mark manages. It would be great to work on a similar initiative at the Cathedral in the context of the Season of Creation.

CARE OF CREATION

The 2022 Lambeth Conference of Anglican Bishops Lambeth Call on the Environment and Sustainable Development, reads:

The Anglican Communion is a connected body. We are local. We are global; We are impacted by the environmental crisis. We contributed to the problem, we can contribute to the solution; The Five Marks of Mission call us to share the Good News and express our concern for people and the planet; Acting together, we can protect restore and safeguard the environment; For ourselves and for future generations we must act now and urgently.



THE GLOBAL ANGLICAN CHURCH

The mission of the Church is the Mission of Christ.
The 5 marks of mission are:

- 1. To proclaim the Good News of the kingdom.**
- 2. To teach, baptise and nurture new believers.**
- 3. To respond to human need with loving service.**
- 4. To seek to transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind and pursue peace and reconciliation**
- 5. To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth.**

Summarised in the key words: evangelising, teaching, compassion, justice and care of creation. Specifically for the 4th and 5th mark;
In seeking justice - we remember that Jesus Christ sends us 'into the world' to love, to serve and seek the "wellbeing of the people around us.
In using and caring for creation - we are handling what belongs to Jesus Christ from the time of creation.



THE DIOCESE OF AOTEAROA, NZ AND POLYNESIA

The Auckland Anglican Response to the Climate Crisis (AARCC) 2020 plan provides ministry units with a framework and goals to achieve in four areas of action:

Liturgy and Worship - To incorporate creation care into our worship and liturgical practices.

Education - To have an educational focus on climate change and sustainability issues.

Mitigation - To reduce our carbon footprint, move towards renewable forms of energy and follow good practices.

Advocacy and Outreach - To be a prophetic voice for; social change, reform of political and economic structures that cause or exacerbate climate change and to reach out to the wider community collaborating with local initiatives for care of creation as a role model for sustainability.

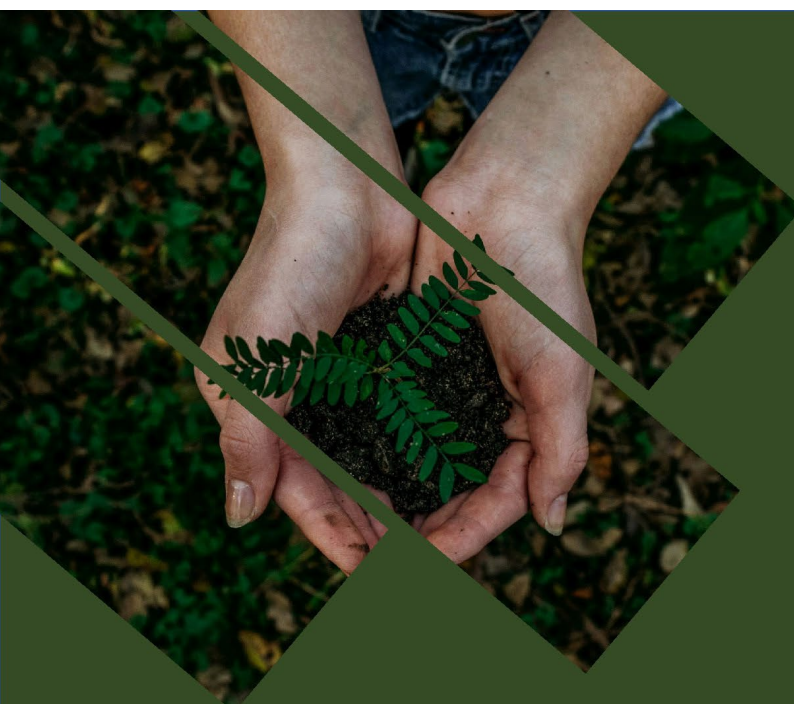
HOLY TRINITY CATHEDRAL

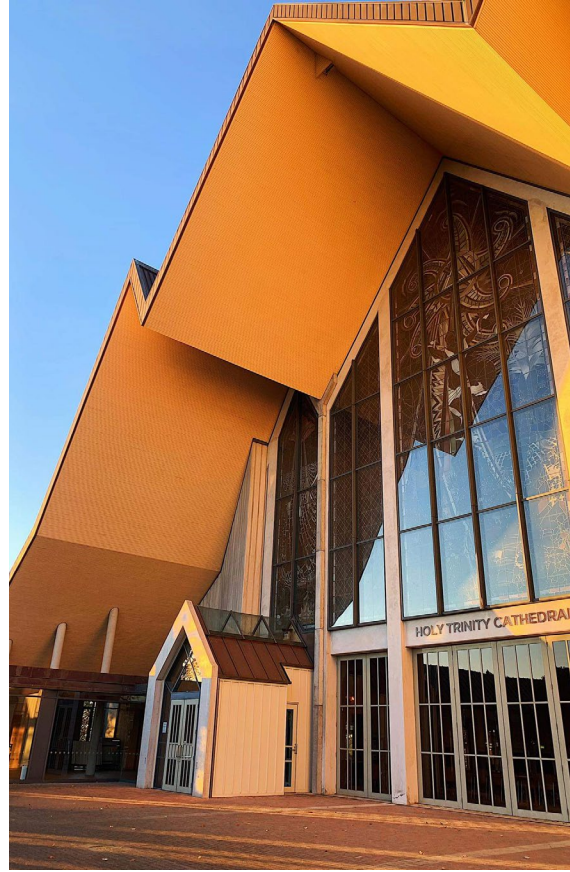
