Those who were at Evensong last Sunday (18 August) enjoyed one of the great jewels of the choral repertoire, Benjamin Britten's *Hymn to the Virgin* with the choir in the choir stalls and a small ensemble up by the high altar. The separation of voices gave great beauty to Britten's masterful composition. The choir also sang music by two contemporary British female composers: Responses by Joanna Forbes-L'Estrange and Evening Canticles by Sarah MacDonald. The Evensong repertoire has become much loved for creating a contemplative mood at the end of the day. We encourage you to come and experience that with us.

This week (25 August at 5pm) the choir sings music by composers active in the first half of the 20th century William Harris, Gordon Jacob, and American composer Amy Beach. I warmly encourage you to come and experience Choral Evensong at Holy Trinity Cathedral for yourself.

The 2022 Lambeth Conference of Anglican Bishops Lambeth Call on the Environment and Sustainable Development, reads:

The Anglican Communion is a connected body. We are local. We are global; We are impacted by the environmental crisis. We contributed to the problem, we can contribute to the solution; The Five Marks of Mission call us to share Good News and express our concern for people and the planet; Acting together, we can protect restore and safeguard the environment; For ourselves and for future generations we must act now and urgently.

As part of our Cathedral Strategic action we are committed to developing policy and action for the Care of Creation.

A small working group has been designing the theology, purpose and objectives of our work in this area of responsibility as a Christian community.

On Sunday 8th September as part of the Care of Creation month we will offer a presentation outlining the work we have done so far.

MARK THE DATE because on Sunday 22 September from 11.30am-1pm you are invited to a workshop where we will begin putting some action around our theology and purpose.

- We will have a look at the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals and explore how they inform our work.
- We will set up a working group to measure the parishes current carbon footprint,
- and look at an eco-church survey that will help us baseline our current sustainability efforts and practices.

This will be a very hands-on collaborative workshop and we would love as many of you as possible to join us for this exciting development and see what we have done and what we could do going forward to be faithful stewards of God's creation.

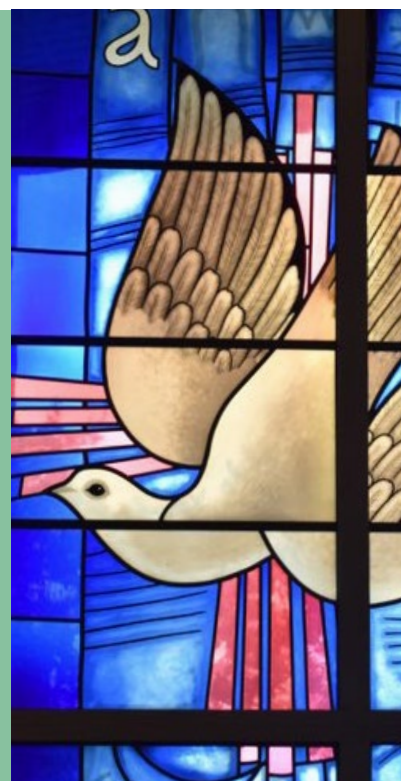

THE HOLY TRINITY CATHEDRAL STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN 2024

Kia ora, I'm Paul Bushnell, the Dean's Warden at Holy Trinity Cathedral.



“ We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is giving, then give generously. ”
- Romans 12:8

These words come from another Paul – the saint, in his letter to the Romans. They provide the framing for the launch of our **24 for 24** stewardship campaign.

Parishioners contribute as volunteers across an extraordinary range of activities in the Cathedral, and that is something to celebrate. However, there's another aspect of our giving which is critical to the running of this place, and that is money.

Why is this stewardship campaign needed?

It costs \$1.2m every year to run this unique precinct – providing worship, liturgy, civic commemoration, music, performance, and public and private events.

So where does the money come from?

We gratefully receive 80% of it from a range of sources. There are trusts – such as the Cathedral Trust for Ministry, Music and Mission. There is an annual operational grant from the Diocese, there are bequests, venue hire fees for events both large and small, car parking, and sundry income. The remaining 20% of our annual income comes from giving which we as parishioners do. It currently totals \$220,000 per year. This sounds like a lot, but this figure hasn't changed in five years—in fact since the last stewardship campaign in 2019. This is probably because most giving now is by AP—automatic payments that each of us has set up to transfer a sum to the Cathedral's account on a regular basis. This was a big help during the Covid years, however, there is a downside –that it's so easy to set and forget this arrangement.

The problem?

In the five years since 2019, inflation has eaten away 24% of the value of an unchanged donation. So that is why, in 2024, we're setting the goal of increasing regular giving to update this amount. If we can raise current giving by 24%, or nearly a quarter extra, we'll raise the annual giving total to over \$270,000. This will help in keeping the budget stable, and allowing the Cathedral to operate sustainably. It's the reason for the campaign name **24 for 24**.

How can I help?

So, the challenge in front of us all (myself included) is:

- To begin making one-off gifts or regular contributions if you haven't done so yet.
- To increase the amount, if you currently give regularly, by up to 24%.

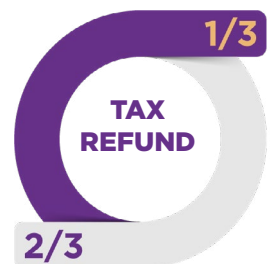
Remember too, that for every dollar you donate, you get one third back as a tax refund.

Let me also acknowledge that for some in our parish, a **24 for 24** target isn't possible. No problem! Give whatever you can. It will be gratefully received and put to good use.

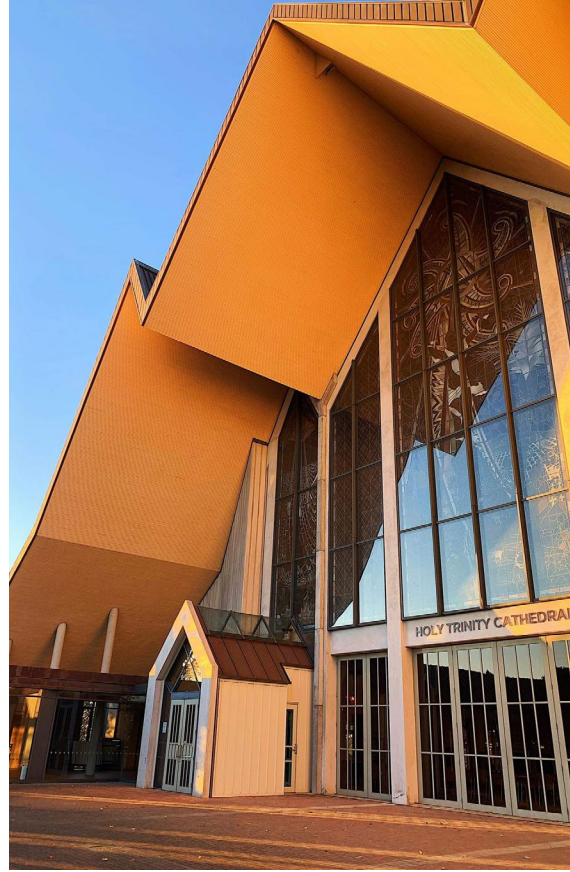
