If we fall in love with creation deeper and deeper, we shall respond to its endangerment with passion. We shall awaken from our dullness and rise vigorously toward justice.

These words sound very contemporary and relevant to our struggles to confront the climate crisis. They were written by the German Abbess, composer, philosopher, and mystic Hildegard of Bingen, who lived in the twelfth century. Hildegard coined the term 'Viriditas', which she explained as meaning 'God's living power of light in Creation.'

Advent marks the start of a new year in the Church Calendar. A time of new beginnings. As we prepare for Advent we will gather over four sessions to explore what 'God's living power of light in Creation' might imply for us. We will consider how we might tend to fresh green shoots emerging in our journey of faith as we seek to follow that light.

ANGLICANS HUNGRY FOR CHANGE
