God has promised forgiveness to all who truly repent, turn to Christ in faith and are themselves forgiving. In silence we call to mind our sins.


Silence

We are truly sorry. We repent and turn to you. Forgive us, for our Saviour Christ's sake,

and renew our lives to the glory of your name. Amen.

The Absolution

Through the cross of Christ. God have mercy on you, pardon you and set you free. Know that you are forgiven and be at peace. God strengthen you in all goodness and keep you in life eternal. Amen.

Please stand.

Gloria - repeat after cantor at beginning and as indicated.



Glory to God in the highest, and peace to God's people on earth. Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. R. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer. *R.*

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. *R.*

The Collect

Let us pray.

Silence

God of all grace, your Son Jesus Christ is the light of the world. Let his bright star stand over the place where the poor have to live; lead our sages to wisdom and the rulers of the world to reverence; through the same Jesus Christ our Redeemer, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Responsorial Psalm Psalm 72

The congregation repeats the response R. after the Cantor, and between each verse.



Give the king your justice, O God: and your righteousness to a king's son, that he may judge your people rightly: and uphold the poor with justice. *R.*

May he come down like rain upon the grass: like showers that water the earth. In his days may righteousness flourish: and abundance of peace till the moon is no more. *R.*

May the kings of Tarshish and of the isles pay tribute: the kings of Sheba and Seba bring their gifts.

May all kings fall prostrate before him: and all nations render him service. *R.*

He shall deliver the needy when they cry: and the poor who have no helper. He shall have pity on the weak and the needy: and save the lives of the poor. *R.*



Sermon

Following the Sermon, we pause to discern what the Spirit is saying to the Church.

The Renewal of Baptismal Vows

Please stand.

The Altar party processes to the baptismal font.

The water is poured into the baptismal font then the Presider blesses the water.

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to offer thanks and praise.

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life. We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore filled with joy, we celebrate the day when your Son, Jesus Christ, was baptised in the waters of Jordan.

At the following words, the Presider touches the water:

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour. To Christ, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The Presider leads people into Renewal of Baptismal Vows.

E te whānau a te Karaiti, let us ask the Lord our God to bless this water he has created, which we shall use to recall our baptism. May God's Spirit renew us and keep us faithful to the faith of our baptism, which we now profess.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of the Father, and will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Presider sprinkles the congregation in remembrance of our baptism and the Altar party returns to their seats.

Prayers of the People

Let us pray for the church and the world giving thanks for God's goodness. *Please sit.*

To the bidding: God of our searching, all respond: be known to us as love.

The Prayers conclude with the following Collect prayed by all.

God of the universe, your good news is for all the peoples of the earth. Hear our prayers and grant what we need through Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Peace

Please stand.

The peace of Christ be always with you.

And also with you.

E te whānau, we are the body of Christ.

By one Spirit we were baptised into one body.

Keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

Amen. We are bound by the love of Christ.

Please turn and acknowledge those around you by offering a greeting of Peace. During the Offertory Hymn, the bread and wine are prepared for the Eucharist. A Collection is taken at this stage.




Blessed are you, God of all creation, through your goodness we have these gifts to share. Accept and use our offerings for your glory and for the service of your kingdom.

The Great Thanksgiving

It is our custom to stand throughout the following prayer.





It is right indeed, everliving God,


to give you thanks and praise through Christ your only Son.

You are the source of all life and goodness;

through your eternal Word you have created all things from the beginning.

When we sinned and turned away you called us back to yourself and gave your Son to share our human nature. In him the light which shines for all has come into the world, and he has become one with us that we may become one with you. In him you have made us a holy people by sending upon us your holy and lifegiving Spirit. Therefore with the faithful who rest in him, with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, forever praising you and singing:

Sanctus and Benedictus are sung by the cantor and congregation.



All glory and thanksgiving to you, holy Father; on the night before he died your Son, Jesus Christ, took bread; when he had given you thanks, he broke it, gave it to his disciples, and said: Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you; do this to remember me.

After supper he took the cup; when he had given you thanks, he gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you, for this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins; do this as often as you drink it, to remember me.

Therefore loving God, recalling your great goodness to us in Christ, his suffering and death, his resurrection and ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate our redemption with this bread of life and this cup of salvation.


And so we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.


Bread is broken in silence.

If you wish to receive a blessing only, please fold your arms across your chest.

As you wait to receive and after returning to your seat, please observe silence and pray for those around you. The Presider will distribute communion at the seats of those who have reduced mobility.

The cantor will sing during the Communion.

Prayer after Communion

Please stand.

Thanksgiving and love and praise to you Jesus Christ. You are God revealed in human form; you are the baby visited by the shepherds, the boy in the temple learning the law; the man baptised in water and the Spirit driven to the desert to face the tempter.

You are Christ the teacher, Christ the healer.

You went to Jerusalem to give your life as a ransom for us all.

May we who have been your guests at this communion reveal your life to all the world.

May we be no longer your servants, but know your will, and be your friends.

You give us your life, may we be worthy of it; you give us yourself, may we embody you.
